This gauge is set the same length raker. I use on the average timber, it depends on the putting point you carry,

on falling saws I carry one notch of lead, some fellers want more and some don't want any. bucking saws I don't carry any lead. But the same length as on falling saw, with this length of raker, I joint saw lightly every filing. If you dot joint every time you have to carry.

a shorter rake, I start
slotting off rake in center
of saw. leading edge of
rake first and then the trailing
edge. That gives saw a little
lead with out changing
length of gauge that is if
you dont joint,

This gauge throws about
4000 of an inch to the
notch.
