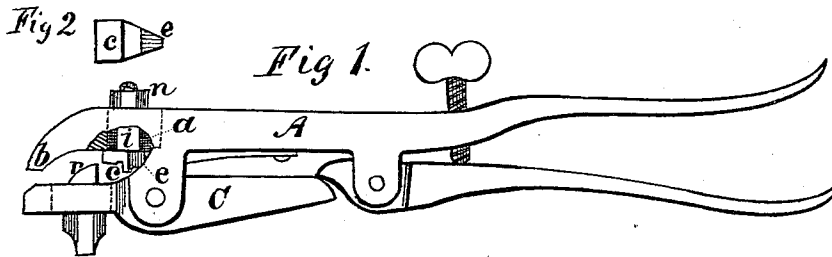

IMPROVEMENT IN SAW-SETS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. **148,861**, dated March 24, 1874; application filed October 14, 1873.

CASE B.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, MOSES E. TRUE, of Oakfield, in the county of Genesee and State of New York, have invented certain Improvements in Saw-Sets, of which the following is a specification:

This invention consists in the employment of an adjustable and detachable tooth-rest in saw-sets, having either a fixed or an adjustable anvil.

Figure 1 represents a side view of a saw-set, having my invention attached. Fig. 2 is an enlarged face view of the tooth-rest detached.

It has been found desirable to provide a reversible tooth-rest for this class of saw-sets; and this invention constitutes an additional improvement upon the invention recently patented by me, and bearing date October 14, 1873.

I construct the implement mainly the same as before, except the fixed jaw, which is mortised, as shown at *a* in Fig. 1. The tooth-rest *c* is made separately and provided with a flat or square shank, *i*, with a threaded end, to receive the nut *n* after the shank is inserted through the mortise. This mortise is made considerably longer than the width of the

shank, so as to admit of changes in the adjustment of the tooth-rest. This latter is made reversible, being provided with a shoulder on two opposite sides, one of which is adapted to coarse heavy saws, and the other, *e*, to medium and fine saws.

By making this tooth-rest adjustable, the implement might be used quite advantageously with a fixed anvil, *r*, but it would not be so generally applicable as with an adjustable anvil; therefore, I prefer to have both adjustable.

The operation of this implement, after the anvil and the movable rest have been properly adjusted, is precisely the same as that set forth in my said former patent.

What I claim as my invention is—

The longitudinally-adjustable and reversible rest *c* and rest *b* on the stock *A*, in combination with a fixed or an adjustable anvil, *r*, on the pivoted lever *C*, substantially in the manner, and for the purposes set forth.
