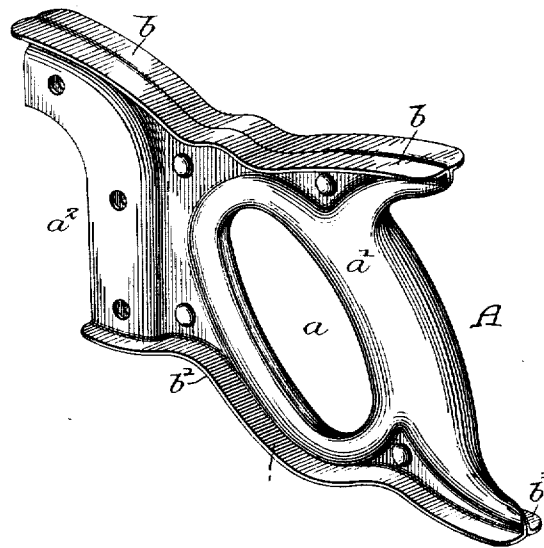

DESIGN FOR A SAW-HANDLE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 33,617, dated November 27, 1900.

Application filed August 15, 1900. Serial No. 26,995. Term of patent 14 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EDWIN F. SHAW, a citizen of the United States, residing in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented and
5 produced a certain new and original Design for Saw-Handles, of which the following is a specification.

My design for a saw-handle is clearly illustrated in the accompanying drawing, the figure of which illustrates the handle in perspective.
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The essential feature of the design is the handle having laterally-extending flanges at the upper and lower edges thereof.

15 A is the handle, having undulating upper and lower edges and an eye *a*. This eye forms a handhold *a'*. The handle has a grooved

end *a''*, partly curved. Projecting on each side of the upper edge of the handle is a flange *b*, and projecting on each side of the lower edge of the handle is a flange *b'*. The flanges conform to the undulating upper and lower edges, as shown.

I claim—

The design for a saw-handle as herein described and as illustrated in the accompanying drawing.
