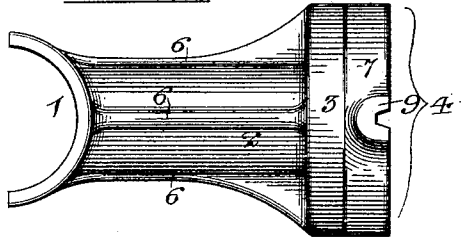

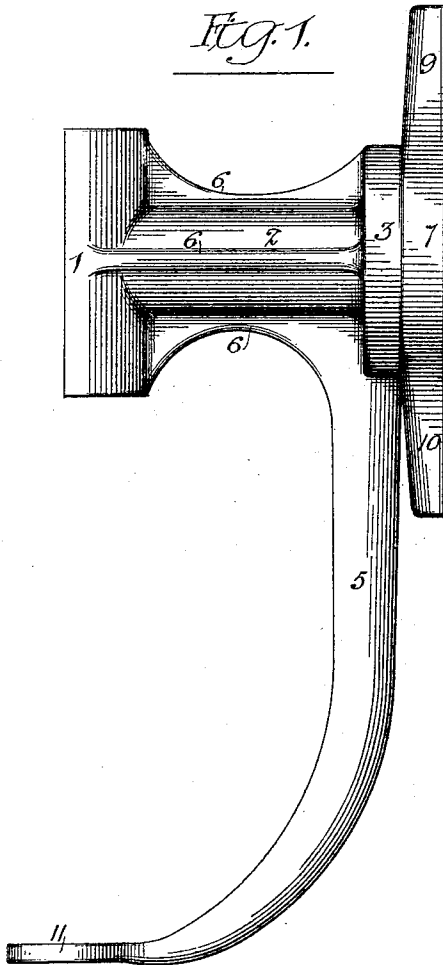
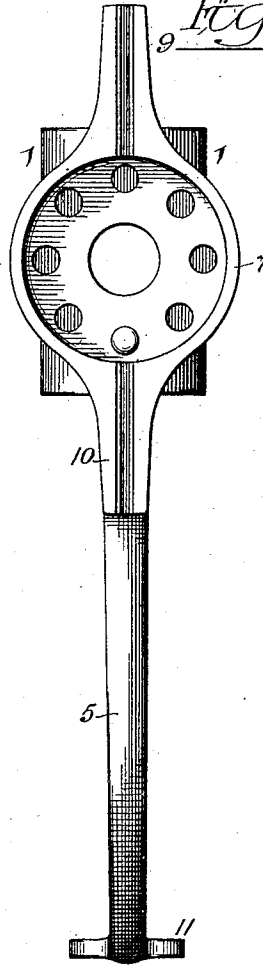

DESIGN FOR A CROSSCUT-SAW-HANDLE MEMBER.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 35,483, dated December 24, 1901.

Application filed November 8, 1901. Serial No. 81,627. Term of patent 14 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, LEONARD SHALLCROSS, a citizen of the United States, residing in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented and produced a new and original Design for a Crosscut-Saw-Handle Member, of which the following is a specification.

My design is fully shown in the accompanying drawings, in which—

Figure 1 represents a side view of the handle member; Fig. 2, a front view of the same, and Fig. 3 a top view.

The design comprises a handle member having the clamp-section 1, the projecting post 2, with boss 3 at the outer end of the same, the elongated blade-receiver 4, and the depending guard 5. The clamp-section 1 is semi-cylindrical in form, and the projecting post 2 is cylindrical and has projecting ribs 6 at the top, bottom, and sides. The elongated blade-receiver 4 has a central circular portion 7,

with an upwardly-extending grooved leg 9 and a downwardly-extending grooved leg 10. The guard 5 extends downwardly from the boss 3 and the lower rib 6 of the post 2 and is curved outwardly at the bottom and terminates in the bottom plate 11 of the handle member.

Having thus described my invention, I claim and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

The design for a crosscut-saw-handle member, substantially as described and as shown in the accompanying drawings.
